## **Group 1 Sewage Pumping Station Upgrades and Rehabilitation Project New Toronto Sewage Pumping Station, 31 Lake Shore Drive, Etobicoke**

New Toronto sewage pumping station located at 31 Lake Shore Drive, Etobicoke (see map on pg. 2) is an existing sewage pumping station that pumps wastewater to larger sewers so that the wastewater can ultimately flow by gravity to a wastewater treatment plant.

Toronto Water is undertaking a project to upgrade and rehabilitate six sewage pumping stations located throughout the City. New Toronto sewage pumping station is one of six sewage pumping stations in this project to be upgraded and rehabilitated.

### **Construction Details**

Upgrade work includes replacing existing aged pumps with new submersible sewage pumps, electrical upgrades, and installing new instrumentation and control devices. Structural and architectural improvements will also be made in order to restore the existing structures and improve the system reliability and efficiency.

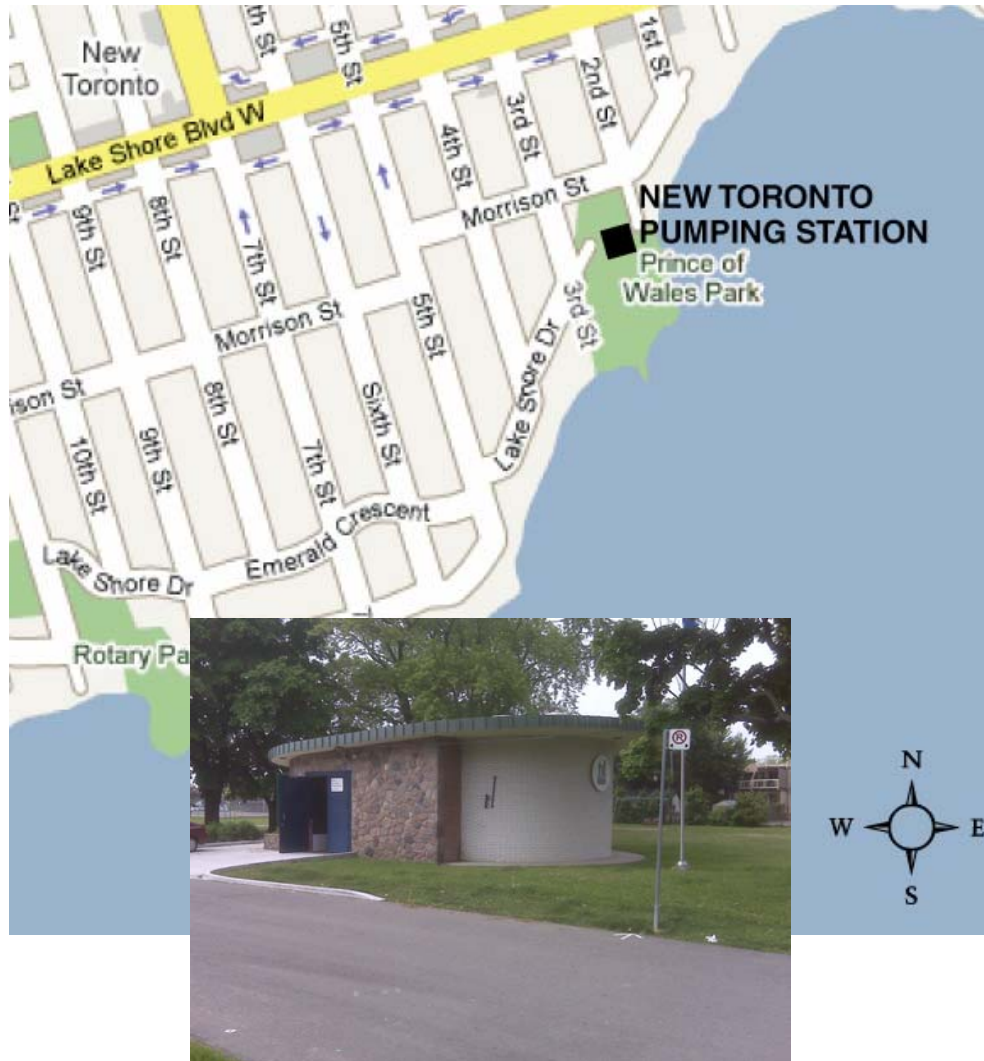
The majority of the upgrade work will take place within the sewage pumping station building. The only upgrade work that will be noticeable to nearby residents and businesses is related to the installation of a temporary standby system which is necessary to ensure that no disruption to the sewage pumping station services occurs as construction takes place.

Work to install the temporary standby system will take place periodically between February and May, 2010. While the temporary standby system is being installed, construction equipment and project staff will be on site at the sewage pumping station.

### **Work Hours**

Work will normally take place between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. Monday to Friday. When required, some work may take place outside of these normal working hours. Construction related noise is expected.
